STEWARDSHIP

A question that I am often asked is, "how is our church (PCOP) doing financially?" As I am a glass half full person, I answer "OK, but it could be better." Looking at our most recent statements we are projected to finish the year with a deficit of about \$25,000. The leadership of PCOP hopes that we can reduce, or eliminate that deficit before the year end, but to do this we need your help.

Looking at the statements, an item of concern is our current giving. We are about \$5000 behind in our pledged offerings. The leadership hopes that we, the congregation, will step up, give more, and meet the commitment of \$170,720.

Loose offerings are donations that are made by members and friends of the congregation that do not pledge. Historically we receive about \$17,000 in loose offerings. Currently, we are on track to receive that full amount, but again we need your help to meet this goal. Please continue to give freely and plentifully to support our ministry.

The following reflection comes from Day 1 of 33 Days of Stewardship Discovery Guide by authors Dave Sutherland and Kirk Nowery.

The essence of life is not ownership but stewardship – the faithful management of all that God entrusts to us. Some of us are entrusted with a lot, some with a little; but whatever comes to us brings with it an undeniable responsibility. The temptation is to think that the abundance is found in possessing life's benefits, when actually it's discovered in stewarding life's blessings.

Dear Lord, please help us to be good stewards of the bounty that you shared with us. Together, as stewards of that bounty, help us to ensure the financial security of our church so that we can continue to minister to our congregation and community. Amen.

The P2 theme was "Open Your Hearts to God's Wisdom and Goodness." Communion was celebrated twice during the season. Devotions were quotations from a variety of Christian thinkers across the ages, including some of today's important voices, that focus on how God's wisdom can impact our lives and, in turn, the lives of others. Three different quotations were emailed twice each week.

PCOP's Food Pantry was our local mission. Insights from a social worker from one of the schools the pantry serves brought a deeper understanding of the prevalence of poverty within our community, how it affects families, and how PCOP's Food Pantry is a source of light to families who are served.

Feed My Starving (FMSC) was our global mission. Thirty volunteers from PCOP took part in a meaningful and, also fun, packing event. Before heading over to FMSC, we enjoyed a light supper at the Kenters (thanks to Mary and Tom for their hospitality!). "Team P2" comprised a range of ages and some fresh faces and, along with the other volunteers that evening, we packed a total of 24,408 meals. This will feed 66 people for a year and put a dent in the massive problem of global hunger.

Beautiful weather graced the church's Picnic Brunch on July 30th. There was a great turnout and the tables were groaning with an abundance of food. Thanks to all who added a delicious dish!

Thanks also to the many people who participated or helped during the season in other ways—donating to the pantry, volunteering at and/or financially supporting FMSC, ushering, bringing food to Fellowship on Sundays.

HARVEST 1: WITH GOD ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE

"With God All Things Are Possible" is the theme for the 2023 Harvest 1 Season. The scripture readings reminded us that what seems impossible for us as humans, is possible with God by our sides.

- Moses bringing the Israelites out of Egypt. "But Moses said to God, 'Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?' He said, 'I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God on this mountain." Exodus 3: 11-12

Our Mission focus will be the Peace & Global Witness offering that will be collected thru the end of Harvest I. 25% of the monies collected for this offering will go back to the PCOP Food Pantry. We are looking at the possibility to raise \$1000 so that \$250 will go back to our Pantry. You can either include the donation in your weekly pledge envelope, or put a separate donation in one of the Peace & Global Witness offering envelopes that are on the table in the Narthex and put in the offering plate. In addition to that, our local mission focus will be for collections of personal health and cleaning products for the clients of the Township of Palatine Food Pantry. You can obtain a list of what is needed on the table in the Narthex and place those items in the trunk located in the entryway.

For Christian Education, Pastor RJ will lead a series on "Does God Have a Sense of Humor." Tuesday morning bible study will be in person and Thursday night will be on zoom. For Devotions, DFF Wendy Canedy will be sharing stories from the "God Winks" series about messages from God that you are not alone and everything will be ok.

Communion will be served on World Communion Day, October 1

And on October 1, we will have a joint worship service and fellowship with the church of servants. You won't want to miss this event! On Easter Sunday last year, the members of the church of servants impressed us with their delicious food. It is now our turn to show their members our culinary skills! There will be a sign up sign in the foyer to let us know what you can bring that day. On other Sundays during our season, we will be serving coffee and juice and we would appreciate any sweet or savory treats to share.

As we move through the season look for the signs of God winking in your daily life and remember, with God all things are possible!
