#### STEWARDSHIP

This is an exciting time for the Stewardship Team. We are finalizing the 2024 budget for presentation to Session. One key piece of information that was needed was the result of our pledge drive.

November 26th was Dedication Sunday. During the worship service we dedicated our gifts of time and talent as well as the financial pledges that have been received, and the Season Team signup sheets for 2024. Deacons and Elders were installed that day. Dedication Sunday is a day of celebration as we remember that each and every one of us is called by God to be stewards. As stewards we give from all aspects of our lives, and are living examples of Christ's gospel, proclaiming faith through all that we do and give. Peter wrote that "Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received." (1 Peter 4:10 NRSV)

The pledges that were dedicated that day totaled \$137,774. (This is \$11,256 less than the initial pledge last year). The income that we expect from all sources in 2024 is \$267,921. Our expenses for 2024 are expected to be: \$331,756. This leaves a deficit of \$63,835. You are encouraged to prayerfully consider your 2024 pledge. If you have pledged, thank you. Please let us know if you are able to pledge more. If you haven't pledged, please consider doing so now. It is through our offerings that we keep our ministries and mission alive. As Pastor RJ mentioned in the pledge letter, "As we look ahead to 2024, there's an exciting path before us."

#### PC (USA) 101

### What is the history and use of the Advent wreath?

The Advent wreath visually marks the time leading up to Christmas and symbolizes the increasing light as Christ draws near to us. The use of such wreaths began as a family devotional practice in German homes in the 1600s. Widespread liturgical use only dates back to the middle of the 20th century.

Each of the four purple or blue candles around the periphery of the wreath marks one of the Sundays in Advent; the white Christ candle in the center is lit on Christmas Eve. Some Advent wreaths include a pink candle. This custom can be traced to a medieval practice that set aside the third Sunday in Lent (and later, Advent) as an occasion of joy and a respite from the rigors of the penitential season. If an Advent wreath has a pink candle, it may be lit on the third Sunday of Advent.

Over the years, particular interpretations added to individual candles, such as shepherds, angels, wise men and Mary; or hope, faith, love and joy. Advent candles can be either purple or blue to represent royalty.

Far more important than any direct correlation of candle to a special meaning, however, is our growing celebration of Jesus' birth and the anticipation of Christ's coming again.
